

On March 29, Jim Clay received the Mary Magdelene Award from the Core Committee of Southeastern Pennsylvania Women's Ordination Conference (SEPA-WOC). Jim is an active, valued volunteer with both SEPA-WOC and serves as co-chair of the Liturgy Service Group for Dignity/Philadelphia.

The Mary Magdalene Award was established in 2007. The yearly award is named after Mary Magdalene, who according to early Church fathers was the "apostle to the apostles," the female follower of Jesus who has been misrepresented and whose pivotal role in the early church was marginalized since the sixth century. For these reasons, Mary Magdalene is considered by many to be the patron of women, particularly those claiming their rightful places, in the Roman Catholic Church.

It appears, based on the SEPA-WOC website, that this is the first time they have given this award to a male! Congratulations and thank you, Jim Clay, for your witness and service!.

BILL CLOSSEY - FEB. 26, 1949 - MARCH 1, 2018



We lost a dear friend and member of Dignity on March 1, 2018. Bill Clossey had been a member of Dignity Philadelphia for 20 years; he had just turned 69 on February 26, 2018. It was an unexpected death, due to medical complications, and his loss was a shock to many of us in Dignity/ Philadelphia. He was surrounded by his husband, Ricardo Ben-Safed, his brother Joseph and his sister Sr. Patricia, CSC, at the time of his death. Bill had been a lector for Dignity, and periodically he and Ric would read from the old and new testaments. He will certainly be missed by this community.

Bill lived and worked in Center City; he had worked at the Philadelphia Free Library for 20 years, and often talked about retiring. Many of us Dignity members had attended his wedding to Ric, months after same sex marriage became legal. And Anne Butchart was the officiant in the courtroom where the service took place. We also

remember their reception at a nearby Chinese restaurant. He had such life, spirit and charm that made us love him.

His Funeral Mass was on Saturday, March 10 at St. Luke and the Epiphany and based on the attendance, it was evident that he was affectionately remembered and loved by people that knew him. Many of us proceeded to the interment which took place at Woodlands Cemetery. Here he had a combination of a Jewish and Catholic burial service. For many of us this was a touching and educational experience. Afterwards we were treated to a repast back at St. Luke's; this was provided by his sister.

His name is now on the Banner of Angels which hangs on our walls during our Sunday liturgy. As with all the names on the banners, he leaves behind a community who loved him, and will miss him. He will, however, continue to live in our hearts and surely no one will forget his smile and love of the Phillies! God speed on your spiritual journey, Bill Clossey!

"I took Bill for granted at the library. I just knew he would be there, he would have the books I needed, and he would refuse my money when I was late in returning my books, he recommended books for me, and he was always ready to help me. I have not returned to the Independence Library since his death, especially when my mother said there was a big picture of him and a memorial book that patrons were signing in English and Mandarin. I just can't believe he is gone."

"Bill lived in the city and always took the bus to and from work. However, I gather Bill loved to drive. Various times when he and Ric had things to do outside the city, they would rent a car. And when he had the car, he would tell, not ask, us that he was giving us a ride home. He lived on 19th Street; we live on 49th Street, so it wasn't as if we were on his way home! He insisted on taking us home. One Sunday in December, Michelle was out of town, so he told me he was taking me home. But he had to take another Dignity member home first, since he lived in "deep" South Philly. After we dropped him home, we got completely lost. Everywhere he turned, or when Ric and I told him to turn, we came upon one way streets, detours or dead ends. Finally we followed a SEPTA bus and we got back on track. A ride that would have taken us 20 minutes took us close to two hours. When they finally got to my house, he admitted that we had not been lost at all. He just wanted me, and Ric, to share in the joy of the Christmas decorations in South Philly, which he said were unique. Ric and I knew he was lying, but I certainly enjoyed the ride!"

"Bill and I had known each other for many years before serving as Regional Representatives from D/P to Dignity's Region III board. In fall 1987 we both attended a regional meeting weekend in Washington and stopped at my apartment to get ready for D/P liturgy. Waiting for me was a voice mail from my sister that my mother was at a terminal stage in her struggle with cancer. Before I could call back, my sister called again that my mother had just passed.

Fortunately for me, Bill was there. He provided a shoulder to cry on and offered words of support. We planned what I needed to do about work the next day, when I could leave for north New Jersey. This became a special bond for Bill and I to share and will always be a fond memory whenever I remember Bill.

MOTIONS FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTIONS

The Board of Directors met March 4 and April 8, 2018, and the following motions came out of these meetings:

Motion 18-03-01: Made by Jimmy Calnan; seconded by Kevin Davies. Be it moved that the April 50/50 be donated to Free Library Philadelphia Independence Branch, Barbara Gittings Collection, in memory of Bill Clossey.

50/50 for April: Independence Branch opened on February, 28, 2001. The library serves as a community center for Chinatown and the other nearby neighborhoods. The name "Independence" recognizes the proximity to Independence National Historic Park. This library has a very large public-library collection of GLBT materials named in honor of Barbara Gittings, a pioneer in the fight for gay and lesbian civil rights, and a leader in efforts to ensure public access to information for all people. Bill Clossey worked at this library for 20 years.

50/50 for May: That May 50/50 be donated to Dawn's Place. Passed unanimously Dawn's Place works to improve the lives of women who have been trafficked, prostituted or pimped. Commercial Sexual Exploitation (CSE) or Sex Trafficking is a form of modern day slavery. It is a residential rehabilitation program for these women.

Motion 18-03-02: Made by Jimmy Calnan; seconded by Kevin Davies. Be it moved that the Audit Report for FY 9-1-16 to 8-31-17 be accepted with special thanks to Mike Viola and Rob Baker for their work. Passed unanimously.

Motion 18-04-01: Made by Jimmy Calnan; seconded by Michael Rocks. Be it moved that the May 2018 50/50 be donated to Siloam. Passed unanimously (*This motion was vacated since we had already designated May 50/50 for Dawn's Place.*)
